Operational Updates & Improved Communication

Looking ahead to 2026, our major capital improvement plans include starting Phase 4 of the irrigation project, which has already proven its value. We are also looking into options for bringing more color and visual interest to our community monuments.

This strategic increase ensures that we can maintain our current beautiful standard of living while planning responsibly for the future.

ARC MESSAGE

Happy Holidays, Tatum Highlands Residents!

As the weather cools and we prepare for the holiday season, please review these important reminders regarding our architectural guidelines. Your cooperation helps keep our neighborhood beautiful for everyone.

Architectural Committee Updates

Holiday Decorations & Lighting

We love seeing the community spirit during the holidays! Please keep these rules in mind as you plan your displays:

- **Permanent Lighting:** All permanent holiday lighting installations (i.e., fixtures that remain year-round) must be approved by the Architectural Committee before installation.
- **Visibility:** Permanent holiday fixtures may not be visible from the street during the non-holiday season.
- **Usage:** Permanent holiday lighting may be illuminated only during the traditional holiday times.

Exterior Projects & Dumpsters

Planning a remodel or clean-out? Remember that Architectural Committee approval is required for visible exterior projects, and specific rules govern dumpster placement:

- **Project Approval:** Always seek Architectural Committee approval for all exterior projects that are visible from the street.
- **Dumpster Rule:** Any use of a dumpster, even for indoor projects, requires prior Architectural Committee approval.
 - Dumpsters must be placed entirely within your driveway.
 - They are prohibited on sidewalks or streets (per Phoenix city ordinance).
 - Limit: Dumpsters have a six-week limit on-site. If you need more time, you must reapply for an extension.

- **Prohibited Items:** Portable toilets are strictly prohibited in driveways or front yards.

Home Maintenance Reminders

Window Screen Standards

A simple detail can make a big difference in curb appeal! Please inspect your window screens now before the holidays:

- **Action Required:** Faded, torn, ripped, or heavily rippled window screens must be taken down or replaced.
- **Approval Note:** Please remember that architectural approval is required for screen replacement to ensure consistency in materials and color.

Low-Water Plant Guidelines

- **Plant Guidelines:** Our updated, low-water plant guidelines are currently available for review on the First Service Residential website at tatumhighlands.connectresident.com, click on Landscape Plant List..
- **Compliance:** Please submit any landscape changes to the Architectural Committee. Utilize the amwua.org/plants website when planning any new landscaping to view approved plants.

HOLIDAY RECIPE TIP:DITCH THE CANNED CRANBERRY SAUCE

Make your own cranberry sauce using fresh or frozen cranberries!

Just follow the instructions on the bag of cranberries but elevate the taste.

- Substitute apple cider or apple juice for the water.
- Toss in a cinnamon stick and some orange rind while the berries are cooking.
- Once the berries have popped and the sauce has thickened, remove the cinnamon stick and orange rind.
- Cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate until ready to serve.

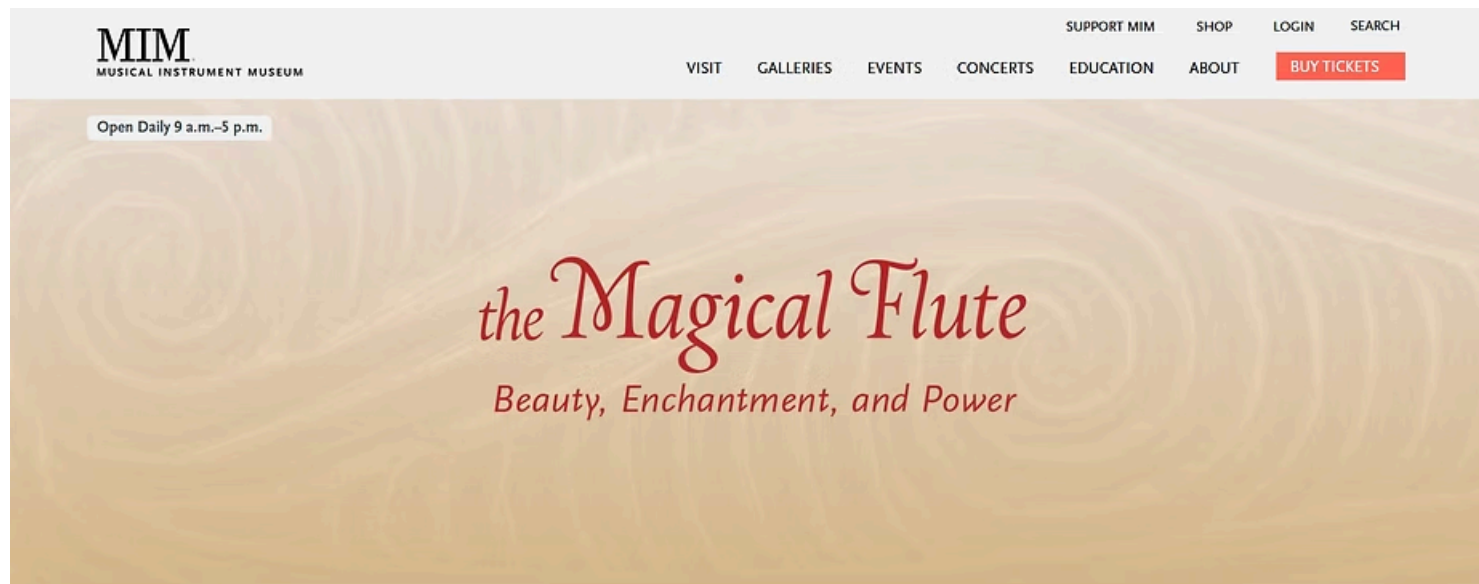
Optional: For a smoother sauce, push the cranberry sauce in small amounts through a sieve to remove the skins and seeds.

GARDEN CALENDAR

December/January

These are the coldest months of the year in the greater Phoenix area. Be prepared to cover frost sensitive plants on evenings when temperatures are below 30 degrees. Use frost cloth available at nurseries or sheets or towels.

Pick spent blossoms and fruit. Pick fruit on the outside of fruit trees that is more exposed to frost.

Prune rose bushes by one half but do not feed until February.

Remove dead branches from trees and plants but delay heavy pruning until March. Plant colorful winter annuals: Alyssum, calendula, pansies, gaillardia, verbena, viola, and snapdragons.

Plant cool weather vegetable transplants such as cabbage, lettuce, artichoke, asparagus, broccoli, and chard.

Plant citrus after the danger of frost is over.

Consider applying organic mulch around your plants to conserve water, shield plant roots, preserve soil temperature, and prevent weed growth.

February

Feed roses.



Fertilize citrus through March.

Plant cool weather annuals such as geraniums, petunias, gaillardia, verbena, snapdragons, and violas.

Plant bulbs such as cannas, dahlias, and gladiolus for late Spring bloom that will receive afternoon shade.

Tomato and pepper starts are available for planting this month.

Remember to cover frost sensitive plants on evenings when we have frost warnings.

Hoe weeds brought on by winter rains. Apply re-emergent.

In late February, prune any frost damage from plants and trees to promote new growth.

March

March is the best planting month in our area.

Prune back lantana as far as you want.

Feed roses and citrus.

Fertilize your plants and trees for optimal growth and health.

Plant annuals such as alyssum, geranium, marigolds, gerbera daisies, Angelita daisies, vinca, salvia, Angelonia, and petunias.

Plant shrubs such as Texas sage, yellow bells, coral fountain, pink fairy duster, and red bird of paradise.

Plant herbs such as basil, chives, oregano, parsley, sage, rosemary, and thyme.

Plant citrus after the danger of frost is over.

PLANT OF THE MONTH: PINK FAIRY DUSTER (Calliandra)

We garden in an arid desert, and the Pink Fairy Duster is a drought tolerant shrub that is perfect for desert landscaping. Plus, it loves full sun and heat. A bonus is it will add a zap of color to your garden.

Fairy Duster produces pink blossoms that look like little feather dusters from Spring through Fall. It's native to southwest desert areas and very easy to care for. Full direct sunlight works best for Fairy Duster. It also does well with reflected heat from walls.

A medium shrub, it grows to 4' by 4'. Feed with Osmocote granules during the blooming season to enjoy the beautiful pink blossoms almost year-round.

While the flowers may not look like it, they attract hummingbirds and butterflies.



Bulk Trash Reminder

- **Just a reminder, bulk trash is now collected by appointment only!**
- With appointment-based bulk trash, customers have the freedom to schedule bulk trash pickup based on when they need it. Residents can schedule a bulk trash pickup through an online portal, which will offer available collection dates based on the customer's address.
- Upon selecting a date, customers will receive an email confirmation and may place their bulk items at the edge of their property no more than 7 days ahead of their pickup appointment.
- Customers are still allowed up to four bulk trash collections each year.
